WHAT IS A BLUE MASS?

A Blue Mass was first held on September 29, 1934 when a Catholic Priest named Thomas Dade started the service as part of his duties with the Catholic Police and Fireman's Society. The Mass was held at

St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Washington, D.C. for about 1,100 police and firemen, all dressed in blue uniforms, giving the Mass its name. The Blue Mass has since grown into a nationwide celebration. Local communities gather to celebrate and thank those who serve their community as policemen and women, firefighters, correctional officers, and EMS responders, as well as to offer prayers to God during the Holy Mass, for their continued protection.

WHY IS A BLUE MASS HELD ON/NEAR SEPTEMBER 29?

Every year in the Catholic Church Liturgical Calendar, September 29 is the feast day of Saint Michael the Archangel, the patron saint of police officers.
